Website Update

2022 ENROLMENTS

Kindy Enrolments due by 23 July (Friday of Week 1, Term 3)

If your child was born between 1 July 2017 and 30 June 2018 they are due to commence Kindy in 2022. To apply please complete an [application form](#) and submit the application along with supporting documentation (essential documentation includes; birth certificate, immunisation information and proof of address) to the school office or by email to lathlain.ps@education.wa.edu.au.

Pre-Primary 2022

Pre-Primary enrolment information will shortly be emailed to all current Kindy families. We required families to complete an application for enrolment form and provide an updated proof of address. Please return the Pre-Primary enrolment application form by Friday 2 July.

Is your child starting high school next year?

Year 6 parents - enrolments are open for students starting Year 7 at public schools in 2022. Contact your school of choice for an application pack. ***Applications need to be returned to your school of choice by Friday 23 July 2020.***

All children from Pre-primary to Year 12 are guaranteed places at their local public school. For students living in the Lathlain catchment area, that high school is Kent Street Senior High. Many students apply to participate in Department of Education specialist programs but it is essential that applications for these are completed and returned by the due date as they are not guaranteed a place at that school.

ANXIETY WORKSHOP AT LATHLAIN

Last week two very experienced psychologists Jenny Edmonds and Deb Cochrane from Triple P (Positive Parenting Program) presented our parents with an information session titled '*Fear-Less, Helping Your Child Manage Anxiety*'. We had a great turn out of parents who had opportunities to ask questions and provide feedback to the presenters. Our own school psychologist Ena Simic provided parents with information on how to get help at the school level, as well as, beyond the school.

The workshop was a great opportunity for parents to mix and learn some strategies to support their children who may be showing some signs of anxiety.

Many areas were discussed;

- Definition of Anxiety
- The Signs of Anxiety
- Being a Role Model
- Building Resilience and Recognising Feelings
- Effective Ways of Coping
- Avoidance and Exposure
- Managing Anxiety - Setting achievable, realistic goals
- Constructive Problem Solving

Our aim is to present a similar session to teachers and education assistants so we can further support the students.

Year 6 students were excited to head to Nanga Bush Camp on Wednesday. They are no doubt having a wonderful time and will return exhausted this afternoon!




NCCD (NATIONALLY CONSISTENT COLLECTION OF DATA)


USB headsets


