Uniform Shop moving offsite

We have made the decision to move our P&C run uniform shop to our supplier store, Uniform Concepts. The school is supporting us with this move and the change will help us manage the supply issues we have been experiencing since COVID and provide additional support with providing uniforms as needed by our growing school population.

The P&C will now pass on the management of uniforms to the school.

Q. What is happening to the onsite uniform shop?

A. The onsite uniform shop is closing for good today, Friday 16th September 2022.

Q. Why is the uniform shop closing?

A. The P&C and the school have decided that the supplier Nell Gray can manage the ordering and supply of uniforms in a more efficient and timely manner.

Q. Where will we get our uniforms from term 4?

A. Uniforms will be available from Nell Gray Uniform Concepts at their Inglewood super store at 832 Beaufort Street Inglewood

They also have an online ordering and delivery service.

Q. What is happening to the existing stock in the uniform shop?

A. Existing stock is being transferred to Nell Gray and the P&C will receive a credit for each item sold. This money will then be used for other school projects.

Q. Will the cost of uniforms rise?

A. There will be small cost increases on some items and others will stay the same.

Q. Will we have sample sizes at the school for all items?

A. A sample of all sizes will be kept at the school
