CELEBRATING ROOM 12



Simple Play Rules.

1. Open the pack and discard the wild cards to the side (these can be used when you become an expert!)

2. Deal five (5) cards to each player


3. Place two (2) cards face up in the centre of the table

4. Place the remainder of the deck in the centre of the table face down.

Golden rule no 1 – at each turn play only one number card from your hand

Take is when a single Number Card from your hand is matched to a card, or combination of cards equalling the same number in the centre. For example, if you have a five (5) in your hand and the centre has a five (5) you can take and claim as your pair. Add the pair face down in your "winning pile"

Keep your pair to the side face down – you will need to add these up at the end of the game.





Golden rule no 2—When you build, you must have the answer in your hand in a single card

Build: If you can't take you build. Build is when a card from the hand is added to your hand in preparation to take (discard into your winning pile) at your next turn. For example, if you have a five (5) in your hand and a two (2) and in the centre is a three (3), you can take the three (3) to add to the two (2) i.e. 2 + 3 = 5. Keep it in your hand until your next turn then you can take those cards and place them into your "winning pile"

Discard: If you cannot take or build you must discard. A discard is placed as a single card in the centre face up alongside the other cards and then pick up a card from the deck. Remember to always restore your hand to ensure you have five (5) cards after every turn.

End of Game: When the deck is finished, keep playing until one player is out of cards. Any left over cards in the centre are added to the winning pile of the person who did the last take of the game. All players cards are counted and the person with the most cards wins the game.

Alternatively, you can add all the numbers in your win pile together and person with the highest number when added together wings the game.



Room 12 love Maths and we want to share with you our favourite game that we play in one of our rotations.

WHAT IS NUMERO?

Numero is a game for all ages which can be tailored to the level of difficulty to match the ability of the players.

In class we play as a game between two people, this provides optimum playing conditions to challenge minds and improve number skills, however it can be played up to four players.

There are only three simple rules in the game of Numero

1, Each turn, play only one Number card from your hand – take, build or discard

2. When you build, you must have the answer in your hand in a single card

3. A wild card when played from your hand, gives you an extra turn.
