Learn more about Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD)

ADHD is a neurodevelopmental disorder (refers to the development of the pathways in the brain) in which there is abnormal dopamine neurotransmitter systems, and this affects executive functioning (paying attention, organisation, task initiation, time management planning, staying on task) and emotional regulation (easily frustrated, struggles to work with others or interact with their peers, sensitive to correction and criticism).

This can lead to problems with personal, social, academic or occupational functioning.

Typically, this is what is observed;

Inattention – wanders off task, fails to follow through on instructions and appears disorganised. Hyperactivity – excessive motor activity, excessive fidgeting or talkativeness. Impulsivity – act then think, on the mind out the mouth, difficulty waiting their turn and interrupting others.

ADHD is more common in boys than girls and it is estimated that between 5% and 10% of Australians have this condition. In a

class of 30 students, there would be 2-3 students in that class with an ADHD diagnosis. ADHD in children can only be diagnosed by a paediatrician and in adults by a psychiatrist. It is recognised as a disability under the Disability Discrimination Act 1992. Our school's psychologist and teachers will support the assessment processes by having meetings with parents, conducting some pre-assessments and providing some information for appointments.

What strategies works?

A range of strategies can improve the quality of life of a person with ADHD, however, it is necessary to have a combined approach, so these strategies become known, rehearsed and then eventually habitual. It is important to note, that medication is only one strategy, and it alone may not be the answer.

- Setting a specific time to work on a task eg 10minutes then stopping. We call this task chunking.
- 70% of children respond positively to medication and is determined by the medical practitioner and parent.
- Empathy is important, so making positive connections between home and school can assist with reducing anxiety.
- Being flexible and allowing more time to process instructions.
- Collaborate on solutions, getting them involved.
- Use interests as motivators.
- Praise as much as possible to reinforce expected behaviours.
- Provide stimulation, such as, walking or riding to school.
- Movement breaks allows for a reset to connect and begin again.
- Use of fidget or sensory toys.
- Wobble cushions or chairs, again allows for the body to move.
- Standing up to work or lying on the floor where it is an appropriate action.
- Noise cancelling headphones.
- Goal setting making a series of small steps will enable the outcome to be achieved.
- Establishing an emotional regulation Plan which is individualised to the person.
- Visual supports and checklists.
- Each day is a clean slate.

These books are helpful for understanding more about ADHD and recommended strategies or come in and have a discussion with our staff.

SCHOOL PHOTO DAY IS COMING!

Lathlain Primary School Photo Days:

Wednesday 20 & Thursday 21 September. Photo timetable has been sent via Seesaw.

Dear Parents,

Your school photo day is coming! Approximately two weeks prior to the photo day every student will receive a personalised flyer to bring home from Kapture Photography containing your child's unique codes for ordering school photos online.

KEEP YOUR FLYER SECURE!

The unique codes contained on the flyer will be issued only once.

Order **EARLY** for sibling photography

Sibling photos can ONLY be ordered online. Once you receive the personalised flyers for your children, it is imperative that you order your sibling photo early to avoid missing out! There is a physical limit in the school schedule to how many sibling photos can be taken. Once the maximum capacity of sibling orders has been reached, no more sibling orders can be placed.

If maximum capacity is not reached, sibling orders close 12pm midday sharp, one business day prior to the first photo day.

The school or the photographers <u>cannot</u> accept late orders for sibling photography. Please do not ask as your request simply cannot be accommodated.

Order EARLY for discount photo day prices

Order your photos within 10 calendar days of photo day to receive discount photo day prices. Late orders are handled separately to the school delivery and incur a \$30 custom service charge.

Other information

Your school will notify you in a few weeks when **team and special group photos** are available to view and purchase on the Kapture website. Please note; class, individual and sibling portraits are not available to view online prior to purchase.

Kapture offer a money back guarantee for any parent who is not fully satisfied with their photo package. Should you have any queries before or after photo day, please check the FAQ's on the Kapture website.

All students will be photographed individually on photo day for school administration records AS WELL as included in their class group presentation available for purchase to all families. Should there be any reason why your child should <u>NOT</u> be included in the photo shoot -please contact the school office.

If COVID is still active in WA:

For the duration of Covid-19 in WA, please be aware that Kapture are following all recommended health guidelines and safe practices. Our photographers are acutely aware of the evolving situation surrounding Covid-19 and abide by each individual school's Covid-19 policies. Where possible, the photographers will use verbal queues and instructions in an effort to uphold our high standard of student presentation. Students may be instructed by photographers to use single use sterile combs, wet wipes or tissues or to fix their own collars, buttons and stray hairs.


