FROM THE PRINCIPAL



Lathlain Primary School is now in the third year of working alongside

the Department of Transport as a part of the Your Move program. This program encourages students to find more physically active ways of getting to and from school. Mr Vuckovic is leading this program on behalf of Lathlain Primary School and has a "Move Crew" made up of enthusiastic Year 6 students.

Schools can receive various levels of accreditation through their level of engagement with this program. At the end of 2023 we managed to receive Silver level. Since then, in just the first term, we have been able to reach Gold level, through initiatives such as WOW days.

It has also been pleasing to see that on WOW days we have reached 77% of students finding a more active way to and from school. This is above the national average for how students get to and from school, which is fantastic.

AUSTRALIAN GOVERNMENT SCHOOL BROADBAND INITIATIVE



The Australian Government School Student Broadband Initiative (SSBI) is offering free home internet for eligible families with schoolaged students until 31 December 2025.

To be eligible, families must:

- have no active broadband service
- have a device capable of accessing the internet

- live in premises where they can access a standard NBN service
- have a child living at home who is enrolled in an Australian school.

The free broadband starts from the day the service is activated with a participating internet provider. Families will not be placed on a paid service by the internet provider at the end of the free service without consent.

In the 1970s 8 out of 10 students rode or walked to school. Today there are only 2 out of 10




60 minutes

Art Room News

Students have been working hard in the past few weeks,

Both Year 1 and 2 students have completed their second projects inspired by Chinese New Year and learning about colour symbolism. The Year 2 Chinese New Year Pinwheels are displayed in the office. The Year 1 Chinese New Year Line and Colour Lanterns are displayed outside the art room.

Year 1 have now started their Castle's inspired by Paul Klee's Castle and the Sun artwork. Focused on using line to build shapes this week, followed by consolidating their knowledge of primary and secondary colours next week.

Year 2 have begun drawing their Romero Britto inspired artworks. Students will develop their use of line and pattern this week. Then next week we will focus on colour theory, introducing students to "complimentary" and "mono-chromatic" colour combinations.

Year 3 have consolidated their learning around "overlapping" and began learning about the "horizon" whilst working on their Perth City Scape and Reflection Prints.

Year 4 students are now working on a Mad Hatter tea party inspired stacked and overlapping teacup artwork. Which will be finished with learning about complimentary colour combinations whilst using watercolour next week.

Year 5 students completed their Day of the Dead inspired skull prints learning about how colours, shapes and lines can represent meaning in an artwork. This week we finish up with a second Sugar Skull artwork before moving on to a third artwork for the term next week.

Year 6 students have been designing a "softie" by creating an artwork that features value to show implied form. Making it look more realistic and show its character. Students have now begun to trace off their pattern pieces which will be used to cut felt shapes as we begin to bring their designed artworks to life. In the form of a felt soft toy.


Feeling so proud of their work and efforts in the art room. And the year has only just began!


