### FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Kaya / Wanjoo, hello and welcome to the latest edition of the school newsletter. We are now within the Noongar season of Djeran. Djeran season sees a break in the really hot weather. A key indicator of the change of season is the cool nights that bring a dewy presence in the early mornings. The winds will also change, especially in their intensity, with light breezes generally swinging from southerly directions. Many flying ants can be seen cruising around in the light winds.

Djeran is a time of red flowers, especially from the red flowering gum (*Corymbiaficifolia*), as well as the smaller and more petite flowers of the summer flame(*Beaufortia aestiva*). As you travel around the Perth area, you may also notice the red 'rust' and seed cones forming on the male and female she oaks (*Allocasuarina fraseriana*). Banksias start to display their flowers, ensuring that there are nectar food sources for the many small mammals and birds that rely upon them.

Traditionally, foods at this time of year included the zamia seeds that had been collected and stored for treatment during the previous season. The root bulbs of the yanget (Bullrushes), fresh water fish, frogs and turtles were also common foods.

As the season progresses, the nights will become cooler and damp. The onset of cool and rainy days meant that traditional mia mias (houses or shelters) were repaired and updated to make sure they were waterproofed and facing in the right direction in readiness for the deep wintery months to come.

#### **AUSTRALIAN EARLY DEVELOPMENT CENSUS**

Our school will take part in the AEDC between May and July this year. The AEDC is a national census that is conducted every three years by the Australian Government, in partnership with state and territory governments. It measures how children have developed by the time they start their first year of full-time school.

The AEDC is voluntary and it does not measure how well children are doing at school, nor how their school compares to other schools. Instead, it shows how children are growing and progressing in five key areas, what is being done well and what can be improved. AEDC data is used by schools, early childhood organisations, researchers and governments to help plan and improve services and supports for children and families.

### FREE PERIOD PRODUCTS FOR PRIMARY SCHOOLS

Recently the WA State Government announced that they will be providing free period products to all primary schools from Term 3, 2024. Providing free access to these products is designed to ease some cost of living pressure for families and enable students to stay engaged at school and focused on their studies.

Both Libra-branded pads and tampons will be made available.

Our school is committed to improving students understanding of period health and addressing any stigma.

#### **P&C WELCOME PICNIC**

The Lathlain Primary School P&C recently held the annual welcome picnic. This was another highly successful event coordinated by the P&C Association volunteers. DJ Morgan ensured that we were all entertained with some great music during the evening. Thanks to everyone involved for your efforts.

- starting Kindergarten 4 years old by 30 June 2025
- starting Pre-primary, the first year of compulsory school 5 years old by 30 June 2025
- starting Year 7, the first year of secondary school
- changing schools.
- New to Western Australia


# Celebrating Kodomo no Hi in Room 3


This week, we celebrated Kodomo no Hi by engaging in a range of activities with Saito Sensei in our Japanese class.








We wrote Shodo (Japanese calligraphy), using a brush and charcoal ink on paper.

### What he Artists been up to:

Year 1's have been setting up their "sketchbook". This mini scrapbook is something we use to record information about each of the Elements of Art and practice drawing. Only used a few times a year, it is designed to be added to each year, so by the end of year 6 students can see the development of their skills from year 1 to 6.

Year 2's have been learning about "portraits" and working on a very special project for Mother's Day.

Year 3's have started their Ryan Conners inspired cat portrait. Using basic shapes to paint the outline, paint without resting their arm/hand on the desk and mixing black with a colour to create a "shade".

Year 4's began their Wayne Thiebaud inspired treat food.
Focused on the element of "Value" and "Texture" to make it look realistic

Year 5's have been working on communicating an idea to their audience. Using analogous coloured background to show a time of day. Followed by painting a silhouette in the foreground to communicate a place.

Year 6's have started a new artwork inspired by the iconic Australian Artist Ken Done. Focused on learning about "implied" and "real" texture. Students have created a fish drawing and applied texture paste to half. Students will then complete the work using acrylic paint, mixing tints, tones and shades.

Kayleb —Year 4 student at Lathlain Primary School, is the only WA player to be selected for the Aussie Roos.


Kaleb's family have set up a Go Fund Me and also an Australian Sports Foundation link for those who would like to make a tax deductible donation.
